General Information:

Geneva Day School Summer Program was established in 1978 and is licensed by the Maryland State Department of Health and Mental Hygiene and Maryland State Department of Education (MSDE) Office of Child Care (OCC). Geneva Day School Summer Program admits children ages two through six on a non-discriminatory basis without regard to race, color, sex, religion, or national origin.

Our Summer Program follows CDC, MSDE, OCC, and county Health Department guidelines to keep all children and adults safe and healthy. We are asking that every child bring at least two well-fitting masks every day, one to wear and one as a backup. Please practice putting on and taking off now with your child.

Group Information:

Our group ratios are 16:2. Each group will be assigned to use its own classroom, door for entry and exit, and bathroom. Groups will remain together all week and will not commingle with other groups. We will have staggered times for outdoor activities. We will be disinfecting surfaces, toys, and other shared equipment throughout the day. Handwashing will be essential and practiced throughout the day.

Communication Regarding Any COVID-19 Situation:

Summer Program counselors and parents are immediately notified of any positive COVID-19 situation in the program and what procedures the camp is required to perform by the Health Department and the Licensing Specialist. The groups in which COVID-19 occurs will be ventilated, cleaned and disinfected, and sprayed with a disinfectant vapor to kill viruses. Confidentiality of the person(s) involved is always carefully respected.

Drop-Off and Pick-Up Procedures:

Parents will use the carpool line to drop-off and pick-up their child using an assigned carpool number. Please display your carpool number on your visor. Children will have their temperature checked by a camp counselor before the child can exit their car. All persons over the age of 2 in the vehicle must wear masks during drop-off and pick-up.

Lunch and Snack:

Nutritious morning and afternoon snacks are provided. Children should bring their own lunch in containers that they can open independently. We will be refrigerating lunches after arrival. Please pack the lunch in a lunchbox with your child's name. No water bottles are allowed. We will provide water and milk.





Clothing:

Lightweight summer play clothes are considered appropriate dress, with closed-toed shoes for safety. We ask that each child bring a tote bag to camp each day with his/her name clearly marked. Tote bags are available for purchase in the Office. Please pack a swimsuit, towel, and water shoes for water play, a hat for outdoors activities, and masks; sunglasses are optional. All personal articles must be labeled with the child's name. We recommend parents send an extra set of clothes in a Ziploc bag, labeled with your child's name, to be kept in the classroom in case of any accidents.

Sunscreen and Bug Spray:

The use of sunscreen and bug spray is advisable for all outdoor activities. Please apply it before your child arrives at camp. Our counselors are happy to re-apply sunscreen and bug spray if given permission for any full-day campers. Please provide approval on the registration form and provide us with sunscreen and bug spray labeled with your child's name in a Ziploc bag to keep in their tote bag.

Summer Program 2022 Themes & Specials

Session 1 (June 6 - 10): Pets
